Dear Assistant Attorney General Clarke,

On behalf of Mothers Against Police Brutality, a national organization based in Dallas, Texas, we, the undersigned, write to request a Department of Justice investigation into the Dallas Police Department's pattern and practice of unlawful conduct that violates residents' constitutional rights.

I. Introduction

Our request describes a long history of impunity in officer-involved-shootings (OIS), custody deaths, and non-fatal violence. This half century of unaccountable police brutality created within the Dallas Police Department (DPD) a culture of racialized violence and abuse of citizens that persists, despite the employment from time to time of police chiefs who offer soothing rhetoric and promises of reform after violent encounters. (See Section II below.)

We found disproportionate impacts on people of color across seven categories of policing that involve use of force or DPD's investigation of misconduct complaints. Our analysis of officer-involved shootings, for example, reveals that Blacks make up about 50 percent of those who have been shot while they represented only 24 percent of the population. Blacks also are more likely to be killed in police shootings. (See Section III below.) Additionally, our review of OIS data indicates that DPD officers have often used deadly force in situations where there is no apparent mortal danger to officers or bystanders, violating departmental policy.

The DPD internal affairs department (IAD) records document how officers with multiple excessive force complaints remain on the job year after year as their violent behavior continues and, in some instances, escalates to homicide. The IAD database we are sharing with the DOJ marks what we believe is an unprecedented citizen acquisition of records from a U.S. police department, covering internal investigation outcomes across five decades between 1968 and 2022. The database has never been published. (See Section V below.) One of the most disturbing patterns discovered is that out of roughly 3,000 excessive-force cases investigated, fewer than 200 resulted in a finding of wrongdoing against officers. The IAD data points to substandard investigations as well as disproportionate violence against Blacks and Latinos. Officer Christopher Hess' case history, for example, illustrates how police officials allowed his decade-long violent streak, which was primarily directed at people of color, to go unchecked. Like Minneapolis police Officer Derek Chauvin, who murdered George Floyd, Officer Hess had a long record of misconduct complaints, 42 in all, yet was rarely disciplined. He was investigated ten times for using excessive force but was kept on patrol until he fatally shot a young Latina mother, Genevive Dawes, in 2017, violating four policies. (See Section IV below.)



DPD has drawn legal sanctions for using force in racially charged demonstrations, which is rare. In the aftermath of Floyd's 2020 murder, DPD was ordered by a federal judge in June of that year to cease its use of tear gas, flashbangs, pepper balls, mace, and other less-lethal weapons of crowd control for the entire summer through September 9, 2020.¹ DPD arrested and jailed at least 50 Black Lives Matter protesters that summer, alleging they were rioting or obstructing a highway—charges that officers have used since the historic civil rights movement to ensnare innocent people participating in racial-justice demonstrations—only to drop most charges after a media investigation exposed the arrests as baseless.²

DPD and the City of Dallas have proven incapable of reforming the Department. One of the latest alleged reforms was the creation of a Community Police Oversight Board in 2019. Due to poor funding and a highly restrictive ordinance, the board can neither perform independent, adequate, nor timely investigations. For instance, the CPOB cannot conduct formal investigations into officer-involved shootings or other serious uses of force until the DPD first completes its own investigations and determines whether discipline is needed—a process that can drag on for more than a year.³ The oversight board's former chairman, Jesuorobo Enobakhare Jr., described its work last year as “exercises in futility.”⁴

We are asking the DOJ to consider these systemic problems and act as soon as possible to prevent further harm. For decades, most federal investigations into police brutality across the country have been triggered by civil unrest following high-profile tragedies such as the murder of George Floyd and the fatal shooting of Michael Brown in Ferguson, Mo. in 2014. The Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex is no stranger to high-profile police shootings, including the deaths of Jordan Edwards, Atatiana Jefferson, and Botham Jean. However, specifically regarding DPD, this request provides an opportunity for the DOJ to take corrective actions that will prevent the next high-profile shooting from occurring by embracing a deliberate, preventive investigative course in a city that prioritizes hiding disturbing trends of police violence from public view. (See sections IV and V below.)

II. Unaccountable: A half century of deadly police violence in Dallas, Texas

The foundational patterns for impunity in Dallas' modern era of police brutality can be traced back at least 54 years. So can the rhetoric of reform, racial healing, and unfulfilled promises of change.

In 1970, Michael Morehead, an 18-year-old Black man was shot to death by Dallas police Officers Darrell Cain and Jeffrey Kirksey. Morehead was running from the site of an alleged burglary. According to the incident report, he ran “into a vacant field where he failed to stop for officers and was shot” multiple times. In the aftermath, there were street protests and racial dialogues. The DPD vowed “to emphasize the value of human life in its firearms policy.” The two officers who shot Morehead were eventually moved from the predominantly Black neighborhood where they served to a predominantly Hispanic area nearby. Neither the City of Dallas nor DPD brought charges nor took corrective actions to prevent future deaths.

Three years later, another DPD officer, Darrell Cain, unlawfully killed another teenager of color. Cain shot 12-year-old Santos Rodriguez in the head while interrogating him by playing “Russian roulette.” Cain was convicted of murder but only sentenced to five years in prison, which is the minimum under Texas law.

After Santos Rodriguez' death not a single Texas officer was convicted of a crime in a fatal police shooting for over 40 years until Roy Oliver was convicted for killing Jordan Edwards. Though Oliver worked for the Balch Springs Police Department, not DPD, the years that passed between Cain's conviction and Oliver's put in perspective how severe the problem of police misconduct is in the City of Dallas and surrounding areas. This problem is heightened by the fact that DPD does not maintain a comprehensive list of citizens

killed by DPD officers. However, media reports document the following snapshots from the 1970s and 1980s:

- In 1978 Dallas police shot 16 people, killing 9.⁵
- In 1979 Dallas police shot 26 people, killing 9.⁵
- In 1980 Dallas police shot 14 people, killing 8, all Black men, between January and June.⁵
- In 1983 Dallas police shot 26 people, killing 13.⁶
- In 1984, Dallas police shot 18 people, killing 10, nine of them Black or Latino, between January and August.⁷
- In 1986 Dallas police shot 29 people, killing 10. As the *Dallas Times Herald* reported, “On a per capita basis, Dallas police last year killed about four times as many people as police in Philadelphia, Baltimore, Phoenix, New York, and Los Angeles and twice as many as Chicago, Houston, San Antonio and Detroit.”⁸

More recently, for the period 2010-2014, Dallas recorded the 3rd highest per capita number of police shootings in the nation (2.7 per 100,000 pop., a higher rate than Chicago, Houston, and New York City).⁹ Dallas was ranked 3rd in the nation in a study of annual killings by police for the period 2009-2012 (5.84 fatal police shootings per 1 million pop., a higher rate than Chicago, Los Angeles, Houston, San Diego, San Antonio, San Francisco, and Austin.)¹⁰

DPD’s long history of unaccountable police violence and killings since 1973 has fallen heavily on Black residents. The killings by officers include fatal shootings of individuals who are elderly – Etta Collins, 1987; unarmed – Clinton Allen, 2013; and mentally ill – Jason Harrison, 2014. The means of death were various: DPD choked some people to death, like Allen Simpson, 2003, and Keenon Forge, 2002; DPD repeatedly ran some people over, like Fred Bradford, Jr., 2013; DPD killed some people through asphyxiation, like Tony Timpa, 2016, and Dee Dee Hall, 2022; and DPD killed people by failing to care for them while in custody, like Diamond Ross, 2021.

The many and varied victims of DPD’s use of deadly force, like Genevive Dawes, were harmed by officers with previous records of violence. Some officers not only went unpunished, but were promoted following deadly assaults on citizens:

- In 2011, Officer Clark Staller chased a suspect with his squad car and struck him, breaking his ankle, a dash-cam video showed. In 2013, he killed Clinton Allen, an unarmed Black father of twins, shooting him seven times including once in the back at close range.
- In 2016, four Dallas officers responded to a 911 call from Tony Timpa, a man suffering a mental health crisis related to schizophrenia and depression. The officers mocked him and forced him face down into the dry grass. One officer, Dustin Dillard, pressed his knee into his back, restraining him for almost 14 minutes. A grand jury indicted Dillard and two other officers on misdemeanor charges of deadly conduct in 2017; however after the indicting District Attorney, Faith Johnson, was replaced by District Attorney John Creuzot, the charges were dismissed in 2019. In 2022, Dillard was promoted to Sr. Corporal, a position that involves training rookie officers.



- One of the officers accused of not intervening to stop the force used on Tony Timpa, Sr. Corporal Raymond Dominguez, shot and killed an unarmed Black youth, Shawn Watson, in September 2007.
- Officer Martin Rivera killed an unarmed Black youth, Brandon Washington, in 2007, yet DPD promoted him to Senior Corporal and he became a trainer in narcotics and SWAT.
- Amber Guyger, the only Dallas officer since 1973 convicted of a crime in all these extrajudicial killings, was trained and mentored by Senior Corporal Martin Rivera. Officer Guyger shot and killed an unarmed Black man, Botham Jean, in his own apartment in September 2018. She was convicted of murder in 2019 and sentenced to 10 years in prison.¹¹

The killing of Botham Jean generated the same kind of racial dialogues, official apologies, and promises of reform that the city saw after Officer Cain killed Michael Morehead more than 50 years ago.

III. Racial Impact and Outcomes in Dallas Police Department’s Use of Deadly Force

A) Black residents make up nearly half of those shot by police

Use of deadly force by DPD disproportionately impacts Black people. We examined a dataset of OISs for the years 2003-2017, analyzing 231 shootings involving 238 individual subjects.¹²

Table 1 below summarizes the number and race/ethnicity of the subjects of OISs for the period.

In the 2010 Census for the City of Dallas, i.e., roughly the midpoint in our study period, Black residents comprised 24% of the population, yet they comprised 49% of DPD deadly force fatalities.¹³ Conversely,



white people comprise 28% of the population, yet they comprise only 16% of DPD deadly force fatalities. Not only are Black people disproportionately affected by DPD’s use of deadly force, they are also most likely to be victims of *fatal* police shootings, making up 47% of people shot to death by DPD officers, as shown below in Table 1.1. In fatal DPD shootings, Black and Latino residents together comprise 71% of the total death toll.

B) Outcomes in officer involved shootings suggest that Dallas officers’ perceptions of danger can be inaccurate when they use deadly force

Table 2 summarizes the outcomes of 231 officer-involved shootings for the years 2003 – January 18, 2017. DPD reports 4 categories of outcomes: deceased, injured, shoot-and-miss, and other.

As shown in Table 2 above, when Dallas police used deadly force during this period, about 1/3 of the time the subject was killed (75 outcomes, 32%). About 1/3 of the time the subject was injured (72 outcomes, 31%). Of the total, 83 outcomes involved officers who reported shoot-and-miss incidents (36%).

These outcomes indicate that more than 1/3 of the time, Dallas officers miss their targets. This is a startling figure, given that DPD policy does not authorize officers to fire “warning shots,” to “shoot to wound,” or to shoot solely for the protection of property. Deadly force is only to be used when an officer perceives he, or a bystander, is in danger of serious injury or death. In virtually all of these instances, the officers involved were not killed or injured seriously enough to require hospitalization. Out of 83 shoot-and-miss incidents, in only 2 incidents (2.4%) were officers killed. A total of 9 officers were killed in the line of duty during the study period.¹⁴

C) When the subject is unarmed, both the racial impact and the shoot-and-miss factor are magnified

Table 3 below summarizes the number and race/ethnicity of the subjects of OISs for the period when the suspect is unarmed.¹⁵ The number of Black victims *increases to almost 60% when the victim is unarmed.*

As shown in Table 4 below, when the victim is unarmed, the outcome “Deceased” declines from 32% to 31%, the outcome “Injured” from 31% to 29%. In contrast, the outcome “Shoot-and-Miss” increases significantly from 36% to 40%.

D) Recent OIS data indicate that the proportion of Black people killed by Dallas police has increased to greater than half. Dallas officers continue to shoot-and-miss more than one third of the time

We recently extended our historical analysis to include the years 2018–2022. The more recent officer involved shootings indicate similar patterns.

- There were 36 officer-involved shootings during this five year period, about seven per year, with 38 outcomes: Subject Deceased, 14 (37%); Subject Injured, nine (24%); and Shoot-and-Miss, 15 (39%).¹⁶
- Of the subjects killed, 57% were Black; 36%, Latino/a; and 7%, white. In this period, more than 90% of those shot to death by Dallas police officers were Black and Latino citizens.

In these years, shoot-and-miss remains the highest outcome category. In the 15 shoot-and-miss OISs, no officers were killed; in 2 shoot-and-miss incidents, officers were reported injured.¹⁷ The data suggest that Dallas officers continue to use deadly force when their perceptions of danger are inaccurate and in violation of department policy.

DPD’s database of OIS incidents stopped reporting race/ethnicity, gender, and name of subjects in 2020. Using the state death-in-custody dataset, these features can be found for fatal shooting victims. After 2022 DPD’s database of OIS incidents has not been updated beyond January 2023 (as of August 1, 2024). See Appendix B for all details of the years 2018-2022.



E) Dallas Police Department Deaths in Custody, not OIS, 2017-2023

We also examined DPD deaths-in-custody, excluding OIS deaths, for the period 04-24-2017 through 06-28-2023, using the Texas Attorney General's Deaths in Custody database.¹⁸ (See Appendix C.)

- A death in Dallas police custody occurred about every 10 weeks, 33 in total, during this period.
- More than three-fourths of people who died in custody were Black (42%) or Latino (36%).
- About two-thirds of the deceased subjects were unarmed (64%).
- More than one-third of cases involved “pre-custodial use of force” (36%).
- Two-thirds of the deaths involved restraint with handcuffs (67%); a smaller set involved handcuff restraints plus officer body weight (e.g., Dee Dee Hall in May 2022), physical struggle (John Newton in April 2018), and other means.
- At least 3 cases involved officers' use of a Taser (e.g., Willie Earl Wright in December 2018).

Disciplinary actions or criminal charges related to deaths in custody are extremely rare. Two recent deaths in custody illustrate the pattern of impunity and promotion that has followed other instances of police brutality in Dallas.

In the first example, Dallas police picked up Diamond Ross on Aug. 19, 2018, for outstanding city warrants. She begged for water during her arrest, as recorded by body worn cameras. She was unconscious and limp when officers dragged her into a holding cell at the facility, as recorded by other on-site cameras. She was placed in a wheelchair with her head lolling backward, and a short time later died. Senior Corporal Larry Moody was reprimanded for failure to render assistance. Moody and a second officer, who has since left the force, were no-billed by a Dallas County Grand Jury. Moody was promoted to Sergeant in 2021.¹⁹

In the second example, Dee Dee Hall was obviously distressed when police officers first stopped her on May 26, 2022, walking in the afternoon heat along Garland Road in far East Dallas. Officers exacerbated her distress at every point in their encounter with her. Officers mocked, joked, and laughed at Ms. Hall, manhandled her, and took her to the ground, binding her hands and feet, holding her face down in the dirt. On the videotape of the incident, officers clearly stated they had no reason to arrest her. One said, “Can we get her on resistance?” Another answered, “Not really.” One of the medics said, “We can't transport. We didn't get her vitals.” But they transported her anyway. An ambulance arrived, they placed Ms. Hall in a spit hood, and she stopped breathing on the way to Baylor hospital. She was pronounced dead upon arrival. The officers and a paramedic involved were no-billed by a grand jury a year later.²⁰

IV. Poor excessive force investigations enable police officers with long histories of violence to stay on the job. Many DPD internal investigative practices run afoul of DOJ guidelines

For years we have documented how the Dallas Police Department's internal investigations into allegations of officer brutality fall short, depriving victims – usually people of color – of accountability.

Dallas police have consistently failed to implement basic practice standards recommended by the DOJ and national law enforcement experts to ensure integrity and effectiveness in internal investigations.



Consequently problems have plagued every aspect of the process from DPD's private talks with police associations that result in weak investigative policies, to multiple obstacles for citizens to lodge misconduct complaints, to failures to interview witnesses, including complainants themselves.

The department's disciplinary data, stretching back more than five decades, reflects that officers get pass after pass. A total of more than 29,000 cases of alleged misconduct is contained in the database we are sharing with the DOJ.²¹ They cover a range of incidents such as deadly shootings, excessive force and missing court proceedings, among other infractions.

Here are some of the most alarming figures drawn from analysis of the data:

- Of just over 3,000 cases of excessive force handled by DPD, investigators determined there was wrongdoing in only 6% of the cases.
- In all that time, only 116 of the excessive-force cases—less than 4%—resulted in a recommended punishment of suspension, demotion, or termination. In 29 of these cases the punishments were later reduced. Only 31 cases where a punishment was recommended resulted in a termination, and that number dropped to 14 after removing cases that were later reduced or reclassified.
- Of all misconduct complaints where race was identified, including excessive force, 54% of those who brought allegations were Black, though Blacks comprise only about 24% of the city's population. Blacks and Latinos together accounted for 78% of excessive force complaints in cases where race was identified. (See Chart 1 below.)
- Nine Dallas police officers who faced the most excessive force investigations over the last five decades—137 cases combined—were cleared of wrongdoing in every case except two. Those officers also received an above average number of commendations.
- Sixteen officers including Christopher Hess averaged one or more excessive force cases per year.
- Nearly 1 in 4 former and current Dallas officers, or 23%, have one or more complaints of excessive force
- Although the percentage of excessive force cases sustained (or substantiated) by police is extremely low, white people have the highest percentage of complaints sustained (7.14%), nearly twice the rate of Black complainants. (See Chart 2 below.)

Chart 1: Percentage of total excessive force complaints by race/ethnicity of complainant, 1990-2021.

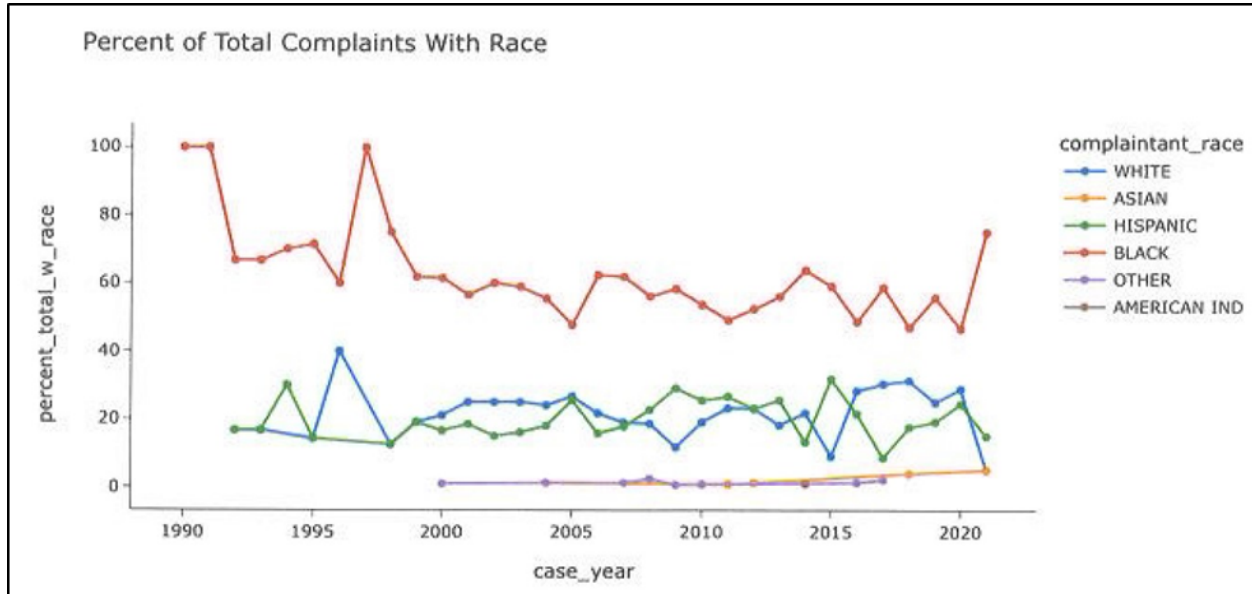
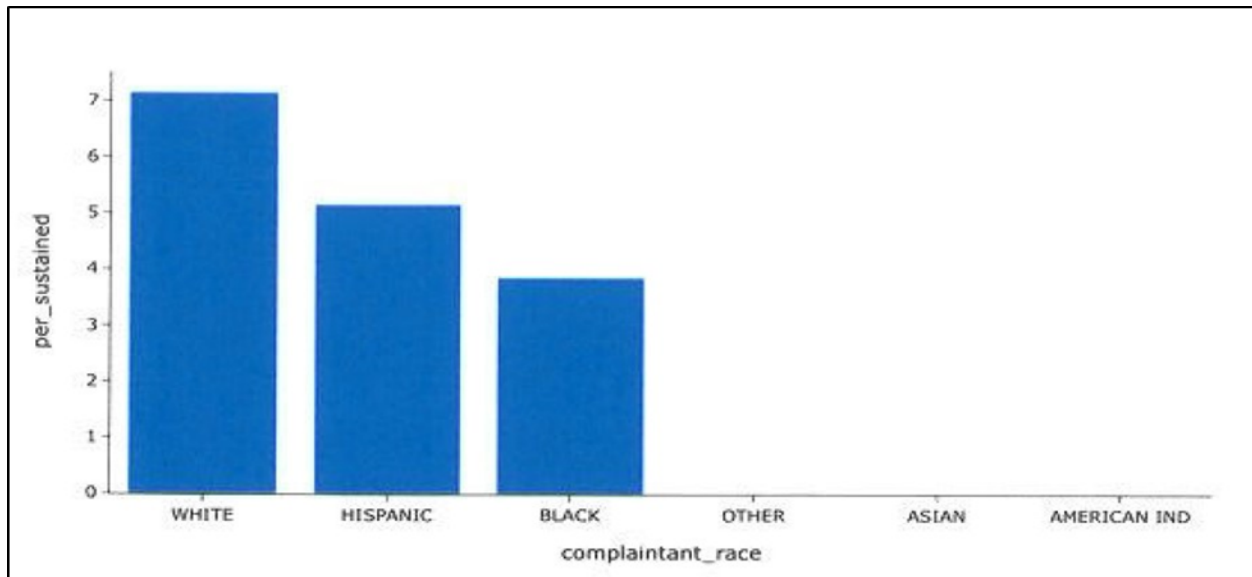


Chart 2: Percentage of complaints of excessive force sustained by race of complainant.



Such expansive internal police data rarely is released by U.S. police departments. Of Texas’ largest cities, Dallas is the only one required under state law to disclose such information.²² Elsewhere across the country, laws generally prohibit disclosure of comprehensive internal affairs data as well as most underlying investigative files.



In Dallas, investigative case documents also are obtainable under open-records laws; yet DPD can take weeks or months, often in violation of Texas Public Information Act, to release a single IAD case.

When IAD case files are finally released they routinely reflect superficial investigations that essentially rubber-stamp officers' accounts. A July 2023 investigation by *The Dallas Morning News* examining the DPD's history of use of force and its impact on minorities highlighted how ten flawed brutality investigations into Officer Christopher Hess cleared him, allowing him to go on to fatally shoot Genevive Dawes.²³ As noted in Section I above, Hess amassed more than 40 misconduct complaints over his 10-year career. His most serious punishment before he was fired following Dawes's death was a reprimand.

DPD investigators repeatedly failed to interview witnesses or closely examine evidence in Officer Hess' excessive-force cases, including dash-cam video that captured his beating of a Black man, Terry Morris, in a 2014 traffic stop. Independent law enforcement experts later described the traffic stop to newspaper reporters as illegal, and the force as "torture."

City and police officials kept the video under wraps for years before the newspaper discovered it and then published an analysis in 2023.²⁴ Former police Chief David Brown, who signed off on the internal investigation clearing Officer Hess of wrongdoing in Morris' beating, repeatedly vowed transparency and crackdowns on officer misconduct. Other high-profile DPD officers found to have similarly extensive histories of brutality complaints include veterans Sgt. Roger Rudloff²⁵ and Frederick Frazier.²⁶

The Dallas Morning News' 2023 investigation highlighted eight ways the department's investigative practices have veered from DOJ guidelines, including: not requiring applicants for internal affairs investigator jobs to possess investigative experience, failures to review accused officers' disciplinary histories for patterns, and no policy for evaluating which allegations of brutality should be examined by the district attorney's office for potential prosecution. Following publication of the newspaper's investigation, Dallas police Chief Eddie Garcia, top city administrators, and City Council members refused to publicly address *The Dallas Morning News'* findings despite pleas from civil rights leaders.

The newspaper's list of DPD shortfalls was far from complete. For example, DPD has long imposed a deadline of 60 days after the date of alleged officer misconduct for people to file complaints. Experts for DOJ and others have long stressed the importance of investigating *every* complaint. Based on this arbitrary deadline, 371 complaint cases were never investigated by the department between January 2006 and the latter half of 2021.²⁷ In more than half of the cases (55%), Blacks were the complainants. We are enclosing a spreadsheet of the rejected complaints obtained from DPD through an open record request in 2022. (See Appendix D.) The city auditor recommended in 2019 that DPD abolish the deadline.²⁸

The 60-day policy fails to account for psychological trauma, fear of police, and other factors that can cause people to delay submitting complaints. It is an example of the many hurdles painfully described by victims of brutality and their family members when they seek investigations. In addition to being turned away by police, they have reported facing laughter, mockery, and evasiveness from police staffers when trying to file complaints. Many people are too fearful to even enter police headquarters and substations.

One of the signatories to this complaint, Collette Flanagan, has direct experience. She filed a complaint after her unarmed son was killed by a Dallas officer in 2013. "First, they told me I could not file a complaint because internal affairs was still investigating the case," she remembers. "When I insisted on filing a complaint against the cop, Clark Staller, who had shot my son seven times, the process took a threatening turn. They made sure I understood that if the DPD found anything inaccurate in my statement, even the smallest detail, that I would be taken to court for making false statements in an official investigation."

The department also has failed to adopt a comprehensive matrix system to guide most disciplinary actions, another reform promoted by DOJ experts and recommended by city auditors to ensure consistency and integrity in such decisions. The state's four other major police departments—Austin, Houston, San Antonio and Fort Worth—have implemented the matrix systems. Dallas has only used matrices for a handful of disciplinary categories.

Meanwhile, the city's government office solely tasked with monitoring and holding police accountable, the Office of Community Police Oversight, is undermined by city ordinances in a variety of ways.²⁹ The office, for example, cannot perform its own investigations of the most critical incidents such as officer-involved shootings until after DPD has concluded its investigations. Sometimes the department takes months or years to wrap up those inquiries or litigation tied to them, blocking access to investigative documents. The oversight office also has employed only a single investigator position since its creation due to low funding from the city.

Many of the DPD accountability lapses, particularly failure to control officers whom citizens report using excessive force, echo problems laid bare by government investigations into other major U.S. police departments. The examples go back to the Christopher Commission probe of the Los Angeles Police Department after Rodney King's 1991 beating. For example, that commission found that LA's internal investigations determined officers used excessive force in only 2% of cases. Following the fatal shooting of Laquan McDonald in Chicago in 2014, it was revealed through court records that Chicago police substantiated wrongdoing in fewer than 5% of citizen complaints filed against officers filed between 2001 and 2015.³⁰ Government investigators in both LA and Chicago determined substantial improvements were needed in their departments' investigative practices. A former official with the DOJ's civil rights division who reviewed Dallas' deficient policies said they mirrored many problems unearthed in DOJ investigations of police departments with patterns of misconduct.³¹

As these examples and dozens of other investigations across the country have shown, outside pressure applied to police departments is essential to force accountability shortfalls out of the shadows so reforms can be pursued in the light. In Dallas, numerous secretive processes, as well as substantial delays in producing records, have stifled the potential for constructive public discourse and reforms.

The process for creating internal investigative policies, for example, is carried out in private consultations between the police chief's office and Dallas' police associations.³² While DPD publishes its final bargaining agreements with union leaders on its website, the contracts contain no detail about decisions the parties reach on changing internal affairs policies, leaving members of the public to painstakingly search online for such revisions. Academic researchers have told us that such omissions make Dallas' bargaining agreements less transparent than the vast majority of U.S. police departments.

Dallas police and city leaders have never posted on DPD's website the disciplinary database we are sharing with the DOJ despite its value in assessing DPD's performance. For more than three years following mass George Floyd protests, city leaders resisted releasing the full database, including racial identities of complainants. It did so only after threats of legal action and appeals to the Texas Attorney General's office.

Dallas City Hall chokes off the flow of information about police misconduct by routinely violating public records laws. At least 60 times over the last three years, the city has failed to meet state-imposed deadlines to turn over public records needed to form an accurate picture of excessive-force trends. Frequently, when the city releases comprehensive documentation so much time has passed that key positions in police or city leadership have changed and the new officials dismiss problems as old issues that are no longer relevant.



Privately, law enforcement officials and police associations also have attempted to intimidate and discredit those who expose evidence of department shortcomings while pointing to the agency's "positive" attributes and the record of their latest "new" chief.

This happened last year when *The Dallas Morning News* planned to publish the internal affairs data described in this complaint as part of its Black & Blue investigative series examining the history of Dallas police violence and its impact on people of color. Editors had repeatedly told newsroom staffers that release of the database would be a valuable public service, allowing residents to check officers' histories of complaints for themselves. Editors even teased its release on July 11, 2023 with the headline "Coming Soon: Numbers Tell a Disturbing Story." After the first installment of the series ran, city and law enforcement officials assailed the newspaper's reporting as unfair in private discussions and correspondence with the news organization's managers. The police chief even threatened to stop working with the newspaper, calling its coverage of the department anti-police and saying, "I'm done with the DMN," according to a text message exchanged by editors on July 25, 2023.³³ As criticism mounted, management stopped publication of the data and the rest of the promised series, without any explanation to the public.

V. Conclusion

In this request for a Department of Justice investigation of the Dallas Police Department we have described a culture of impunity that emerged at DPD through a history of unaccountable officer violence against the public, overwhelmingly impacting Black and Latino residents.

In the words of Rev. Peter Johnson, a longtime Dallas civil rights leader and founder of the Institute for Nonviolence, "The more officers get away with brutality, the more brutal they become. People of color usually bear the consequences."³⁴

In summary, this dangerous culture is illuminated by these findings:

- The lack of adequate investigations and corrective actions in fatal shootings by police over a period spanning almost five decades, documented by the state attorney general's death-in-custody database, press reports and the department's OIS data.
- 81% of those killed in the shootings were Black or Latino.
- 78% of the deaths-in-custody (not OIS deaths) involved Black and Latino residents.
- The high proportion of death-in-custody cases (36%) showed unlawful pre-custodial use of force; that is, excessive force used to make the arrests.
- Only 6% of over 3,000 excessive force cases investigated by DPD's internal affairs investigators were substantiated and only 4% resulted in discipline.
- The inordinate number of internal affairs complaints lodged by Black and Latino residents: 78%, where race is identified.³⁵
- 1 in 4 former and current officers in the database have drawn at least one excessive-force complaint.




- DPD’s internal affairs department’s practices have not conformed to standards recommended by the DOJ.
- DPD allows officers to accumulate multiple excessive-force complaints and remain on the force year after year, despite the fact that officers who are part of this trend have a record of unlawfully killing civilians.


Thus, DPD illustrates what leaders of civil rights groups have stressed since the 1960s: institutions do not (and perhaps cannot) vigorously investigate themselves. Academic research and surveys have strongly indicated over the decades that the “code of silence” is a powerful force in this country’s law enforcement culture, undermining accountability. DPD is not exception.


In Dallas, this code of silence has been embraced by leaders across the political spectrum. City officials rarely discuss excessive force issues publicly, refusing to answer the most basic questions. Law enforcement officials and civic leaders frequently resort to diversionary tactics when serious concerns about use of force arise. An extrajudicial killing by a police officer is typically termed a “tragedy,” not a crime; “regrettable,” not preventable.


We believe that only through an investigation by the DOJ will the city’s leadership seriously confront the throughline of accountability failures in its police force and take meaningful steps to prevent the department from doing further harm to the public, particularly to people of color.

Clarification

In Section III.A) of the request, Table 1 summarizes use of deadly force in Dallas for 231 incidents involving 238 individual citizens – people who were shot to death, shot and injured, or shot at and missed by DPD officers. Table 1.1 summarizes *fatal* police shootings, 74 incidents with 75 deceased victims.

The relevant passage, which appears on p. 4-5, is shown *corrected* below reflect this clarification:

In the 2010 Census for the City of Dallas, i.e., roughly the midpoint in our study period, Black residents comprised 24% of the population, yet they comprised 49% of *people subjected to* DPD deadly force ~~fatalities~~.¹³ Conversely, white people comprise 28% of the population, yet they comprise only 16% of *those subjected to* DPD deadly force ~~fatalities~~.
